Guest speaker talk

James Treloar

Noel Park Award

Our guest speaker this week was our own James Treloar, and as is often the case, the best talks come from in house.

James was recently presented with the Noel Park Award at the local Chamber awards night for his services to our community.

Luckily there were only thirty awards before hand, if there had been fifty he may have been too drunk to get to the stage, we know how those nights can drag on.

Does anyone remember when they had that Victorian guy from the Bakeries many years ago? One of the longest nights of my life.

Anyway, as per normal with James he did not really talk about his award or himself, rather his experiences within Council and local government.

James joined council in 1985 to help Tamworth Rugby club with lease negotiations, which wasn't successful?!

The Magpies might need him to join Council again to help them!!

But he had so much fun he became Deputy Mayor in 1989 and then Mayor in 1995.

Local government was going through a kind of renaissance in those days as the Local Government Act changed and presented Councils with new found "freedoms".

The Tamworth City Council was full of "colorful" characters but performed its role and moved the city ahead.

Achievements included; the development of Peel St, which still draws favorable comments today for its aesthetics.

The further development of the Country Music Festival, taking it from a country event to a 10-day festival with broader appeal was not an easy task.

The funding and building of the TRECC, a great facility with a multitude of uses.

And the establishment of AELEC, a facility we can all be proud of.

The water pipe to Barraba and many more.

But Council life also delivered its ups and downs.

James spoke of the zoning of Shopping World in West Tamworth,

His "holiday" from Council and the role of the media in the new world, where every story is an opinion rather than the story.

Did someone say fake news?

I can still recall the way the media, mostly from the south, grilled James on the Sudanese migrant topic.

It was A Current Affair reporting at its best!!

Perhaps the biggest change to Tamworth came with the amalgamation of Tamworth Council with adjoining councils in 2004.

This enabled our city to move ahead, create subdivisions, bid for larger scale projects and move into the 21st century as a business rather than a council.

But maybe he will be remembered best for his role in the 1A Murray St saga!!



Anyway, a well-deserved award to a truly community minded person. Well done James.


