Round Three (Semi-Finals) in February usually held in Walcha – the four finalists are chosen for Round Four – Finals at District Conference (March) where the overall winner is announced.

At our meeting last Wednesday (17 October), we had two wonderful speakers - Impana Dayananda from Carinya and Abigail Dayananda, from McCarthy.

Both presented a five (5) minute prepared speech that could be based on any subject but had to address at least one aspect of the Rotary Four (4) way test.

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Our first speaker was **Impana** who discussed the topic of **Addiction and how it affects those around us.** She looked into the theme of it "being true and fair". Using rhetorical questions, she was able to engage the audience and get them mentally involved in her discussion.

Our second speaker was **Abigail** who discussed "**Inequality and social discrimination and how it has affected the way we act in today's society**". In her speech she covered all aspects of the Four (4) way test. She gave an extremely insightful view of the way society acts today and how it should change.

Our adjudicator was Sarah Massey who had the pleasant but difficult task of listening, assessing and making a final decision – we (the audience) felt very happy that we did not have to make the decision as both applicants were excellent.

We now wish Abigail every success in Round Two – the Cluster finals are on Monday, 29 October at Quirindi RSL at 7:00pm.

All are welcome to attend the meeting and see and listen to the other finalists.
