

Our Guest Speaker was A/Prof Susan Pendelbury, Director Radiation / Oncology North West Cancer Centre (NWCC). She commenced at NWCC in January 2017 was previously at Sydney St Vincent's Private and Royal Prince Alfred Hospitals.

Susan opened her talk by showing us the map below and confirming that her area covers from Scone to the south up to the Queensland border. Services a population of 120,000 with vastly different needs quite different to Metropolitan area.





The BCT accrual target is 300 participants. A total of 156 participants have been randomised to the EXPERT Trial across all sites in Australia and New Zealand (as at 25th January 2019). Of the 156 participants, 121 participants were randomised by sites participating under the National Mutual Acceptance ethics approval process. The first participant was randomised on 4th September 2017.

- The fitter the patient, the more benefit before, during and after treatment
- NWCC is participating in International Clinical Trials, with the NWCC's participation well above the size of the Centre.
