ANZAC DAY - GUEST SPEAKER WALLY FRANKLIN OAM

Wally has lived in Tamworth for over 30 years and is very active in the community especially in the area of sport. Wally received the NSW Citizen of the Year Award three years ago and this was followed up with an Order of Australia Medal (OAM). Wally is currently on the board of the Academy of Sport.

Wally enlisted into the Australian Army in the late 1960's into Royal Australian Artillery (RAA) and was deployed to Vietnam in 1968 as part of the 131 Divisional Locating Battery, Wally had just turned 19 years old.

Wally stayed in Vietnam until January 1969 and during this time was part of the Battle of Coral – Balmoral. Fire Support Bases (FSB) Coral – Balmoral were located in Bình Dương Province and was first attacked by a significantly larger force of North Vietnamese Army (NVA) units. On the evening of 12 May 1968, the NVA launched a number of battalion sized assaults on FSB Coral. At one point during this assault the FSB was partially over-run resulting in the forward gun being captured. On 16 May 1968 the NVA assaulted FSB Coral with a regiment sized attack and again this was repelled by the Australian Forces and the NVA suffered heavy losses. Overall the Battle for Coral – Balmoral lasted 26 days. The units involved have only recently been acknowledged for this action and have been awarded both Unit and Individual Citations for Gallantry for the actions taken throughout this battle.

After Wally had completed his time in Vietnam he returned to Australia and things were not good. Advised not to wear their uniforms in public and avoid areas such as bars and pubs. Wally found it difficult and decided to return home to Rockhampton to see his family. Wally remembers going to the meatworks to visit his brother, who met him just inside the gate telling him he had to leave because the entire plant had just gone on strike due to him being there. Wally went to the pub to wait for his brother and was treated horribly by patrons, being spat at and called baby killer. This type of treatment was to continue for Wally and others who had gone to fight in Vietnam and was being pushed by the union movement within Australia. Wally spoke about how he had sought treatment in mental hospitals post-Vietnam and how difficult it was to understand the treatment he and others received.

Wally spoke of how family support was one of the things that kept him strong but also spoke of others who succumbed to the effects of both the war and the treatment they received on their return home and some committed suicide. Wally spends his time supporting others from more recent conflicts and has a strong passion for looking after each other when times are tough.

Just a few points out of many that stood out in this talk.

- First time Wally has ever spoken to a group about his experiences in Vietnam and worse was to come when he, and others, returned to Australia that took courage to speak today.
- ➤ 1966 Battle of Long Tan possibly the only battle that Australians are aware of and involved experienced soldiers
- ➤ 1968 Battle of Coral Balmoral had the heaviest action by far of the entire Vietnam war and lasted 26 days of pure hell with underprepared recruits with little to no time to prepare their dugouts before the actual battle against a fully trained battalion began and has only recently been acknowledged by the Federal Government

Questions asked

- Q Why or what created this change throughout Australia against Vietnam Return Soldiers?
- A Basically the Unions Australia Post would not forward letters to the Defence Force members in Vietnam as an example
- Q Were your parents supportive upon your return?
- A Yes my father died at the age of 29 and our mother raised six children on her own.
