

PERSONAL PROFILE - ROB CLIFTON

- Born in Tamworth on 8 August 1955 delivered by Ian Howle's father Don and spent many happy hours at the Howle household as our mothers were great mates.
- Parents are Happy and Keven and had three siblings Richard, David and Anthony.
 Anthony died from complications caused by meningitis aged 4 in 1956.
- Father ran the Holden dealership in Tamworth, Gunnedah, Manilla, Barraba and Bingara and mother was a stay at home mother.
- Early education Peter Pan Preschool (asked to leave), Calrossy Preschool (asked to leave) and finally St Nicholas! Not asked to leave but not sure how much father had to donate to the church!
- Had a great life roaming the streets of East Tamworth where I met James Treloar. We
 managed to get up to quite a bit of mischief without getting into too much trouble. Although
 there was one incident concerning a fire up in the hills at the end of Napier Street (James was
 not involved in that one!)
- Followed in my brother's footsteps and attended St Ignatius College, Riverview in Lane Cove for six years. Really enjoyed boarding school although the other two did not
- Academically did pretty well in the early years but not knowing what I wanted to be -was not very dedicated to studying. I could read and write Latin and was in the advanced maths classes all the way through. When the HSC came along, I passed First Level Physics but missed First Level Maths – didn't do enough work
- Knew from an early age that I did not want a 9 5, Monday to Friday office job. I applied to do architecture but due to my HSC results ended up doing engineering. I passed first year (just) no study / no work did not work in second year. However, my golf handicap did come down a few shots!
- It was about this time I started to think about flying as a career so gave 2nd year away and started flying in December 1977
- First job was in Walgett in 1979 at the Walgett Aero Club
- After a little more study went to Darwin in 1980 for twelve months doing charter work and coastal surveillance. Lots of flying into Aboriginal communities – taking coffins with deceased Aborigines back to their communities was quite an eye opener.
- Verbally invited to a mate's wedding back in Tamworth in August 1981 -sadly the invitation did not arrive so missed the wedding but met my wife, Jen. Wasn't she lucky and she went to the wedding that I missed!
- Worked in Tamworth for the next couple of years at Tamair with the original owners Jim Packer and John Rowarth and also with Keith Singh
- Married in April 1993 and transferred to Sydney with East Coast Airlines which was the forerunner of QantasLink. Jen stayed in Tamworth for the first three months of our marriage.
- January 1984 I did get a job with Qantas and Jen became pregnant with our first child James. He was born in September that year – a very busy period in our life and we moved back to Tamworth in June 1986. April 1986 Samantha arrived on the scene followed by Alistair in November 1988 and Tom in November 1991
- Life went on for the next 35 years with promotions and aircraft type changes. The whole time Jen was at home looking after the four children while I was away approximately six months of each year I must say it appears a bit of a blur!
- Now that I am retired, I look forward to playing more golf, doing more fishing and spending time with my children and five grandchildren with two more on the way.
- Plus a fair bit of travelling coming up, especially around Australia.
- As I said earlier I not great at study but chose a career that required constant study. Every
 iob has its downside but were outweighed by the upsides
- I will finish by saying that I have had a privileged life doing what I love and I have a great and healthy family.

OUTBACK AIR RACE 2018

August 2018 - Brisbane to Broome

The target was to raise \$500,000.00 – we raised \$521,640.00 for the Royal Flying Doctor Service and our team raised just over \$12,000 towards that target and felt very pleased at our first attempt and our Funds went to Broken Hill. The top money-earner was David Tait from Tait Auto Group in Goondiwindi and Moree who raised \$62,552.00 and second place was Peter Clisdall from Mittagong who raised \$28,011.00.

38 Aircraft competed in this race and our team consisted of John Glynn, Dr Guy Fitzgerald and myself – we were "The Tamworth Cruisers" and we flew via Bundaberg, Longreach, Mt Isa, Adels Grove, Daley Waters, Katherine, Kununurra and arrived at Broome.

This is not actually a speed race – it is based on Time Trial and accuracy flying and we came in 22nd – took a while to adjust to the rules and what we actually had to do but it was great fun and we would all love to do it again one day.

Great array of interesting people – Chris was a District Court Judge from Perth – Alan from CFS with his two sons and 12 year old grandson – farmers from Moree and several places in Western Australia – two student pilots – Horace Ho and Eason Chan from Hong Kong and Lee – in his early 20's – built his own aircraft and flew on his own for the entire trip.

Overall it was a great experience!
