GUEST SPEAKER - DISTRICT GOVERNOR PHIL HAFEY – introduced by James Treloar

Phil Hafey thanked us for the warm welcome and opened with a request to every Rotary Club in the District to create a new local project (could be combined within a cluster) – take photos and feed into the local media to promote Rotary

- Example West Kempsey works with the Library Librarian creates a set of books for a week into a package and Rotary delivers – picks up previous week and returns to the Library to help house-bound residents to remain connected
- Example Small schools parents / students prepare breakfast for children who travel to school
- Clubs or Clusters seek NON-government funding for local projects
- Example Port Macquarie Rotary Lodge has received over \$400,000 in non-government grants by "asking" – Schools also need to be aware of the availability of these funds
- RYLA will be at Lake Keepit for the next three years an incredible program and should be so easy to recruit applicants well done to First Light and their strong support
- ENEWS an enjoyable read provide the information with photo to your local media and to ENEWS – it will go in
- Create Combined Cluster Committees and work together on existing / new projects for the benefit of Rotary and the specific Club involved and promote through the media
- Working with Children / Rotary Youth Volunteer Information and Declaration Form Clubs must comply with – rules have changed markedly over past few years
- Rotaract now is the time to act!
- Rotary Lodge (mentioned above) can stay there depending on availability for \$85 per night – can book in for medical reasons or for a holiday – 36 rooms – It is operated as a business
- Finally the Transition team What, Why When Rotary International (RI) has over-ridden this team we will merge on 1 July 2022 no further discussion Phil feels that RI has not complied with Rotary's Four-Way test but will keep us informed of further changes as they arise always read ENEWS for latest information.

Bronwyn spoke about her Partner's Project – **Lifeline –** Well-presented and provided considerable information that many of us were possibly not aware of. It is now available 24 x 7 all over Australia. Easy to check on the Lifeline Website – training is locally provided and it is a "listen and respond"

- 1. Scholarships trainees to assist them
- 2. Fundraisers such as Quirindi inviting Ian McNamarra Band to do a concert at short notice in Quirindi on their way to Coonabarabran raised \$1,700 towards Lifeline.
