


OUR GUEST SPEAKER TODAY IS PETER RYAN BRINGING US UP-TO-DATE WITH THE LATEST INFORMATION ABOUT THE PROPOSED AQUATIC CENTRE OUT NEAR THE AMAZING NETBALL CENTRE, NEW ATHLETICS CENTRE AND THE BRILLIANT "HORSE" CENTRE WITH TRECC CLOSE BY

Peter Ryan addressed our Club last Wednesday, 13 November with an update to the Tamworth Regional Aquatic and Leisure centre.

Currently the project is progressing, with a target completion of March 2023. Prior community engagement in early 2018 identified a strong community interest in seeing this project through, with approx 93% of the 1289 community respondents identifying the project as 'very important' or 'somewhat important' to the future of Tamworth.

Moving forward, the project will bring a range of health and economic benefits to the Tamworth community and region, providing a social space, as well as top class sporting facilities not seen in regional NSW. This, as a result, will allow future sports men and women of tomorrow to have a local facility unlike any other. The ability of the venue to seat up to 500 people (plus a possible 400 more towards the end of the pool) is also of benefit to the sporting community, and sports spectators alike - expected to appeal to a regional population of 200,000 people throughout the New England and North West region.

The economic benefits of the project are also significant-

- The project is anticipated to cost \$67M, with funding drawn from Local, State and Federal grants
- While the face value seems high, the existing sporting infrastructure in Tamworth is ageing, with approx \$37M or (55% of the new venue cost) being needed to bring the existing infrastructure up to date, so building new versus repairing old is a sound economic decision, with the new infrastructure having an estimated 50-year lifespan
- On the jobs front, approx 53 full-time equivalent positions will be generated by the Centre, with an economic benefit of \$264M projected over the foreseeable 20 years. This is before the project jobs growth and local involvement from businesses and the community is taken into account throughout the build
- Marketing the Tamworth Region as a destination for living, working and leisure.





Our thanks to Peter for a most insightful update of the project, I look forward to watching it grow over the coming years.


