Mick Souter came to Tamworth in 1980 at the age of four. He has suffered from grand mal seizures most of his life. He has PTSD and is assisted through the day to day by the love of his life, "Laney", the three-legged wonder dog.

Grand mal seizures cause disturbance in the functioning of both sides of the brain which can make you lose consciousness and have severe muscle contractions. To assist with recovery Mick has taken to writing and performing to stimulate recovery in his brain function.

All the drugs he has been on during his life have played havoc with his teeth. He has a full set of dentures; however, they can become problematic in the event of a seizure.

Natarsha, his wonderful wife, has always encouraged Mick to research, write and perform and remains "his rock." They have six children. Mick's love of the land, animals and Australian history is evident in the poems he recited for us.

Mick can be seen performing during the Festival in Peel Street, opposite The Tudor. He has CD's for sale at \$20 each. So, if you get a chance stop by and say "Gidday" to Mick and don't forget to give Laney a pat.
