



Rob Woolley started with MHERV in 2008 in the Narromine Shire and is hoping to reach 7,000 individuals by the end of these two days at Bunnings Tamworth.

He has been based at Country Shows, Cattle and Sheep Saleyards, Coonamble Gold Cup Races, Bunnings and similar around the countryside and is currently on his fifth Contract with MHERV. He frequently speaks on radio — country people still listen and has a high percentage that visit him because they heard him on the radio.

Some facts about Rob Woolley

- ➤ He has been a nurse for over 30 years huge portfolio of experience
- He has worked in Intensive Care units in many hospitals and trained new staff as patients need special care
- Rob's wife is also a nurse and they spent three years on Cape York in far-north Queensland his position was Men's Health Education Officer
- He also has experience in Rehabilitation Units and in Aged Care.

From the heady days of 2002, with just three students, the School of St Jude now comprises three campuses filled with 1800 students, provides boarding facilities for 1,200, owns and operates 25 buses which transport students and staff, provides 29,000 hot meals each week and employs over 290 people – 95% of whom are Tanzanian.

SOSJ also supports 350 graduates as part of the Beyond St Jude's programme. Between them, they have taught over 60,000 government school students as part of a Community Service Year before going on to tertiary education.

This remarkable institution has been made possible by a symbiosis between the Girl from Guyra and her long-term supporters, many of whom are Rotarians from all over Australia.
