OUR GUEST SPEAKER LAST WEEK WAS AN EX-MEMBER CHRIS WATSON WHO SPOKE ABOUT THE FUTURE OF TRAVEL AND HOW COVID-19 AFFECTED BOTH CRUISING AND AIR TRAVEL RIGHT ACROSS THE TRAVEL INDUSTRY

Introduced by Terry Robinson

- The first real inkling of what was to come happened on 4 February with the first cases of the Corona Virus on the Diamond Princess anchored in Japan for two weeks and the Australian arriving back in Australia for a further two weeks of isolation
- Second and major drama was on 8 February last with the Ruby Princess Chris was a passenger and the cruise was cut short by two days
- Between 8 16 February his travel agency received 96 cancellations
- ➤ 18 February 3 March Chris had to travel to America with 70 clients and flew home out of New York which was the start of the Corona Virus pandemic in the States and on arriving back in Australia had his temperature taken
- In that short time his travel agency had received a further 250 cancellations
- > Followed by a further 700
- Arriving home the first issue was trying to keep all staff Job-keeper has been a major benefit for the travel industry overall just hope that end of September is not a strict cut-off but an easing back over the next period for overall survival
- Further 800 cancellations he and his staff who have worked incredible hours trying to reassess, re-book, re-fund have now seen the very best and the very worst of people during the past four months
- All international tours were cancelled to February 2021
- Trying to refund, rebook etc airlines and cruises kept changing their rules
- ATAS Credit Agency has proved a major benefit and asset have been truly supportive of the Travel Industry
- Went through a bad patch where he stayed home for 24 hours could not face anyone understands why people feel they can't go on
- With all of the above happening people still want to go cruising and already making bookings for next year
- At the same time our business, as every other similar business is looking towards the future and assessing where / what can they do to survive this pandemic
- Looking at "Rediscovering Australia tours" must be local Tasmania, Floriade and similar and bookings already coming in for these tours with amazingly good prices.
- Travel industry first hit and will be the last to recover.

- Q. Rediscover Australia How many tours have you created?
- A. 85 packages currently from short to two-week style tours
- Q. What about flights within Australia?
- A. Qantas has just opened another 300 flights internally New Zealand still considering opening in July the "bubble" but all State borders must be opened first Possibly include some of the relative islands in the Pacific who are Corona Virus free
- Q. Places like Norfolk Island be opened?
 - A. Yes, have some packages available
- Q. YEP students going home / arriving home?
- A. Refunds due in August now offering 70% and claim rest from Insurance Company
- Q. Can airlines make air-travel safer in relation to air-conditioning?
- A. Emirates appear to be leading the way and Qantas is currently offering sanitiser and masks.
