

The Community Events for year of 2019 – 2020 went through three phases.

- 1. The Up and Away and Happening Phase, in the last five months of the 2019, year followed by
- 2. The Rethink and Postpone Phase, in the first 3 months of 2020, to
- 3. The Cancel and Re- appraise Phase in the last four months.

MEN'S HEALTH - THE EDUCATION RURAL VAN

We held two very successful Two-Day Events for the MHERVan at Bunnings car park in August and February with a total of 107 patients coming through the Van. Nurse Rob Woolley had his 7000-patient come through the Van in February; the patient was awarded with a bottle of wine.

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE FUND RAISER

The Xmas Pub Crawl, what a great fundraising Event, held on the 20 December 2019, with five of our local Publican's involved, mixing with the younger generation and appreciating the generosity of the participants. A sum of \$22,000 was raised. Let's hope we can run the Event again and many thanks to Phil Knight for organising.

SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

Early this year, this Event came under a lot of discussion from the Committee due to the extra over the top Newcastle University Charges to run the Event, something like \$2,8000, this meant our Club had to raise the extra funds, either from the schools or Sponsorship.

The Event was Cancelled, with some of the Committee members to meet with University of Newcastle hoping for a better outcome for 2021.

PEDAL the PEEL

In February 2020 this Event was cancelled due to the extra work load required to run the Event and since has gone through a Re-Think Phase. Discussions have proceeded with ideas of running a 12-hour Cycling Event at the new Velodrome Course. Hopefully this Event can take place in the near future.

NORTH WEST REGIONAL CAREERS EXPO

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic this Expo was postponed to the 19 May 2021.Let's hope this Expo can go ahead next near.

REGIONAL WASTE WARRIORS EXPO:

This Expo was coming together with good support from our Sponsors, \$10,000 from NIRW (in the bank), TRC and NICU, we have this Sponsorship until June 2021. Unfortunately, this Expo had to be cancelled due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, we are hoping we can hold the Event within the first 6 months of 2021.

CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA

Held on Sunday, 1 March 2020, a successful Morning was put in cleaning up on the Peel River behind Hungary Jacks. We were very thankful for the help from the students from McCarthy College.

Let us hope the Government Social Distancing Regulations are greatly reduced soon, so our Community Events can go ahead in the coming year. All in all, it has been a rewarding year in the Public Relations (PR) role – enjoyed marketing of our Club to the broader community, and sharing the message of Rotary more broadly.

CURRENT MEMBERSHIP

Membership numbers have dipped during the last twelve months with the following changes:

Start of period – 59 members End of period – 52 members This has been a 12% reduction in membership over the last twelve months.

NEW MEMBERSHIP

No new members inducted over the last twelve months into the club. We had 4 potential members but these did not eventuate due to personal circumstances of the prospective members.

STATISTICS: AVERAGE ATTENDANCE:

Overall, for the year was 77% - based on the unprecedented times that we have been faced with over the last six months maintaining membership engagement has been a challenge. Using new and innovative ideas such as Zoom meetings has continued to maintain contact for members within our Club environment. As we move towards a relaxation of the restrictions meeting attendance is again on the rise.

AVERAGE AGE OF MEMBERS:

The average age of our club membership at the start of the reporting period was 63.9 years old and at the end of the year this changed to 64.4. Average Service of members:

The average years of service for our club at the start of the years was 15.7 years and at the end of the year this changed to 16.4.

PREFACE

2020 was an extraordinary year, not only for our Club; Rotary International; the wider community, but for the entire world. The Covid-19 virus hit with a vengeance in early 2020. It was highly contagious and there was no cure, which caused governments



around the world to shut down just about everything in an effort to reduce the spread. Sporting events were cancelled, schools closed, severe travel restrictions imposed, state borders closed, and the community was ordered to stay in their homes and keep a minimum distance of 1.5M from each other if it was necessary to venture out.

All of our events for 2020 were either postponed or cancelled. Our District Conference and our own Changeover dinner were cancelled, just the same as every other Rotary Club and District in the world.

With our own meeting venue closed, and with social distancing rules in place, there was no option but to cancel meetings. However, the Board continued to meet via tele-conferencing which proved so successful, that the Club decided to continue our regular meetings using the same technology. In this way we were able to catch up with one another, listen to guest speakers, conduct a fine session and even managed to run President Barry's wacky National Anthems.

In mid-June restrictions were relaxed enough that we were able to meet face-to-face for breakfast at the Post Office Hotel.
