## GUEST SPEAKER - ROB LEWIS, QUIRINDI SILO ART

Rob Lewis from Quirindi Rotary gave an engaging and illuminating presentation on the creation of the Quirindi Solo Art Sound & Light Show [pun too good to use just once!]. A committee formed in 2019 conducted extensive research of other solo art installations before agreeing a course of action to promote their town. The highly motivated team then developed a Business Plan to approach both local businesses and government to secure funding to procced with the artwork on the town Grain Corp silos.



Rob showed a short video displaying the magnificent artwork mural commissioned from artist Peter Ryan from WA who was selected from 100 expressions of interest, [not a talent associated with our own 'Peter Ryan']. Raising capital from sponsors and backed by government grants, the project commenced in October 2022 to run for 8 weeks.

Peter used the giant canvas to tell the story of Quirindi; its past, present and into the future. As the artist's first mural, the faith placed in him by the panel was richly rewarded by the outstanding result. Commissioned separately is a video narrated in the local Kamilaroi language telling dreamtime stories accompanied by the haunting resonance of a digeridoo. As the sun sets and darkness descends people gather to watch brilliant images float across the silos. The story is told of Yurrandaaii, the Liverpool Plains tree goanna totem who is the protector of tribal lands. Bandaarr, the grey kangaroo, as the holder of knowledge, bounds across the land warning his kin of threats - and so the message is spread. People look to the laughing kookaburra to guide them to favourable fishing places and reward his laughing advice by sharing their catch. The story then evolves to tell the modern-day history of local industries with panoramic scenic images of crops, working dogs and the significance of the railway. The light and sound show lasts for around 25 minutes. The premiere attracted a street party of 1500 revellers standing in pouring rain - none of whom had seen the production before.

Hailed as an overwhelming success by all, the sound and art show has won many Awards and been proudly adopted by the community. The initial cost of \$800K was fully covered by fundraising and donations. A healthy balance remains to allow local Rotary Club to take over responsibilities from the Silo Art Committee. The show changes annually to update stories of local art, farming, children's activities, and local legends. Accumulated funds will be expended for on site improvements to attract travelling tourists to further stimulate the local community – a 20% uplift is already evident.

Rob's tale is of a vibrant community coming together to produce a 'must see' attraction and in so doing created a lasting tourist attraction for the town. The Quirindi Solo Art is promoted as the "Gateway to the Northwest & Australia's Ultimate Road Trip" and continues to enthral visitors and residents alike.


